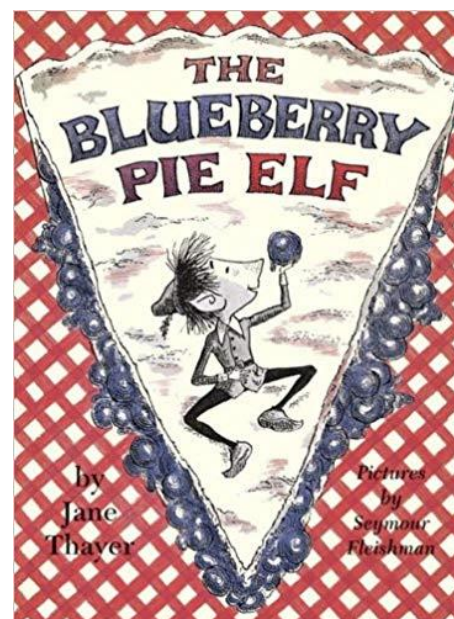



One Little Blueberry

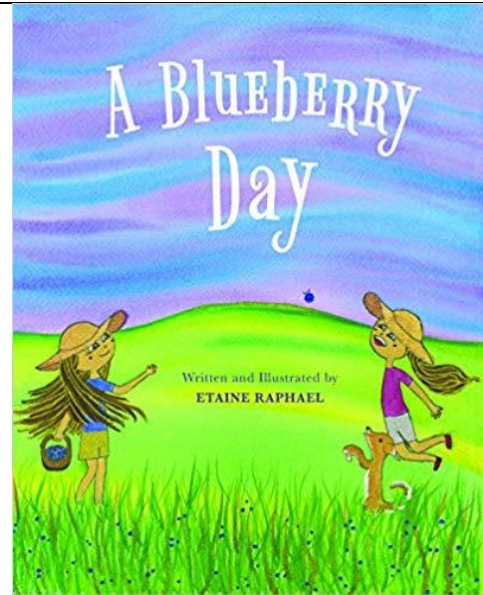
