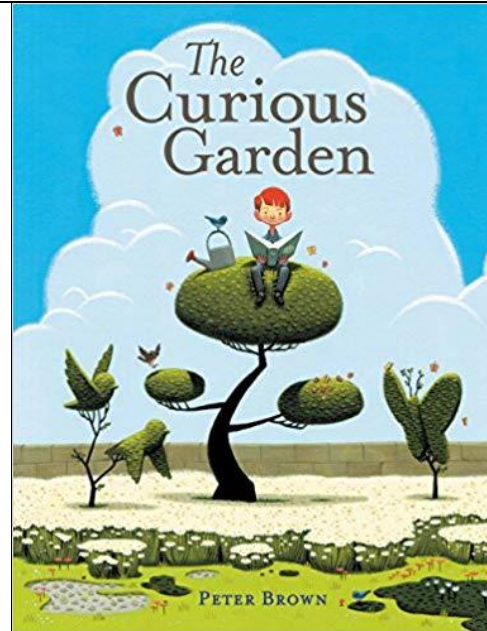
The Curious Garden
